



Dear Parents/Carers

This week our theme is **aspiration week** and we will be talking about our future selves. What would we like to be in the future? We will be watching a video message sent from the RAF and the fire service and reading non-fiction books to give us information about the role of a fire fighter & police officer.

Ways you can help at home:

In **handwriting** we will practise writing the letters **Z & q**, in the correct formation. Can you learn the rhyme?

z zebra 	Zip across, zag down and across the zebra.
qu queen 	For q: Round the queen's face, up to her crown, down her robe with a flick at the end. Catchphrase: qu Quick, it's the queen!

In **maths**, we will be focussing on the numbers **4 and 5**. We will be learning what they look like, to read them, the number formation and how to represent them. We will be making our own collections of four and five and sorting representations of four and five. We will learning different ways to make 4 & 5 - recalling the number bonds, for example - 1 add 4 makes 5, 2 add 3 makes 5 ...

Down and over, down some more, That's the way we make a four. 	Down and around then a flag on high, That's the way to make a five.
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Ways you can help at home:

Phonics learning this week. 14.11.22

We will be learning to read and write the **phonemes z** and the digraphs **zz, qu & ch**. The children will say – **digraph, two letters we trap together to make one sound**. We will read words; **zip, zap, buzz, fizz, quick, quit, chips, rich**, remember to sound talk and blend.

Our tricky words – go, no, to, into, his

A copy will also be in their reading diaries on Friday, so they can continue to practise at home.
